QUESTION: *What is your favorite study spot?*

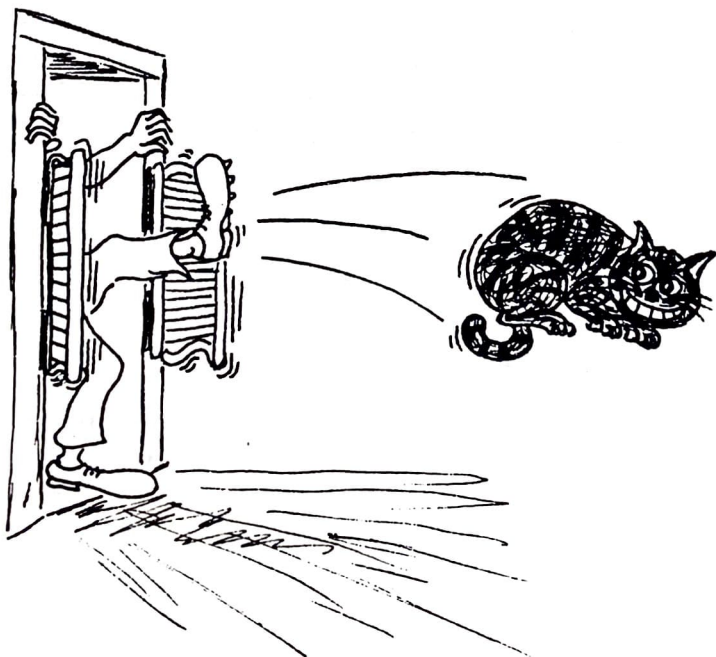
