


MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF TORRENCE CHAPEL A.M.E. ZION CHURCH



HISTORICAL SKETCH: PAST AND PRESENT

STEWARD BOARD

The Board of Stewards was organized about the time that the Trustee Board was organized. The members often served interchangeably on both boards. The following includes names of persons who served as stewards as near as can be determined: Jack Glaspie, Aaron Burton, Alex Pickens, Julius Reid, I. A. Withers, Graham Patterson, Charlie Torrence, Jordan Withers, Sr., John Brice, Johnnie Heath, Ozon Brice, Willie Bell Sloan, Sr., C. C. Cornelius and Margaret Howard—all deceased. Others who have served are Gerald Potts, Thomas Howard, James Davis, Ferman Hill and Wilson Potts.

Present Officers: Preacher Steward—C. W. Howard, Vice Chairman—Willie Gaston, Recording Secretary—Jerry Kornegay, Financial Secretary—Annie Mae Gaston, and Treasurer—Cleo Montieth. Other members are Matthew Barringer, Sammie Barringer, Steven Howard, James Forney, James Derr, James Reid, Johnnie Pitts and John Haywood Gaston.

TRUSTEE BOARD

The Trustee Board began with the founding of the church. Mr. Jack Glaspie, Mr. Plumber Johnson, and Mr. Rufus Potts were among the first trustees. Mr. C. C. Cornelius, Mr. Jordan Withers, Rev. R. C. Jones, Mr. Kenny Davis, and Mr. Elrado Davis were the Trustees on record until 1949. Some others who have served through the years are Wm. Wor, Wilson Black, John Brice, D. S. Reid, Towy Withers, Johnnie Heath, James Barringer Sr., Ozon Brice, Waddell Henderson, Mrs. Nora Caldwell, Craven Davis, James Davis, Eugene Howard, Matthew Barringer, James Foster, James Derr, Willie Torrence, C. W. Howard, James Forney, James Reid. The present board consists of Chairman—Raymond Cuthbertson, Vice Chairman, R. A. Work, Secretary—Daniel Work, Assistant Secretary—Wilson Potts, Home Treasurer—Ferman Hill, and General Secretary—Anitra Howard. Other members are Thomas Howard, Gerald Potts, Clifford Caldwell, Wilson Stinson, William Barringer and Samuel Knox and Rev. G. Sidney Waddell.

THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

The Budget Committee in the past was known as the General Claims Captains. Mr. Ozon Brice served as chairman of this committee until his death. Mrs. Jennie V Brice served as chairperson after her husband's death until 1983.

In 1983 Mr. Willie H. Gaston was elected as chairman and remains in that position to this date. Other captains are: Mrs. Estelle Withers, Mrs. Mazella Forney, Mrs. Lillian McNeely, Mrs. Gertrude Long, Mrs Bobbie L. Potts, Mrs. Mary Reid, Mrs. Vertie Torrence. Ms. Annie M. Gaston is the Secretary for this group.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Building Committee was revised in October 1962 with Rev. J. N. Torrence as pastor. The officers were Chairman—Wilson Potts, Secretary—Samuel Knox, and Treasurer—Raymond Cuthbertson. A new addition—twenty-four by forty foot front, which included an office, a classroom, and a balcony to seat 109 persons—was added to the church in 1964.

Under the leadership of Rev. E. W. Hayes, our present educational building was constructed in 1971. It is a two-story building with a kitchen, dining room, two restrooms, an office, and choir room on first floor. On second floor, you will find classrooms, a nursery, a library, and the pastor's office. Also during this time a new altar railing was built, central air was installed and parking area was paved.

In 1982 we made a change in the front of the church. What had been a classroom and an office, was changed and two restrooms were built. We also built a ramp and reserved two parking spaces for the handicapped.

STEWARDESS BOARD NO. 1

Stewardess Board No. 1 was organized under the pastorate of the late Rev. H. H. Jackson in 1911 with the late Mrs. Liza Stinson serving as president for forty years. Other presidents include Mrs. Bessie Bush, Mrs. Lucy Patterson, Mrs. Mary Stinson and Mrs. Annie Work (all deceased). Present officers are: President—Miss Diane Work, Vice-President—Mrs. Georgia Work, Secretary—Mrs. Rosena Work, Assistant Secretary—Marilyn Work, Corresponding Secretary—Jennie V. Brice, Co-Chaplains—Mrs. Lottie Little and Mrs. Bennie Waddell.

Members are: Mrs. Lola Harrison, Mrs. Ada Caldwell, Mrs. Katherine Work, Mrs. Odessa Haynes, Mrs. Emily Kornegay.

STEWARDESS BOARD NO. 2

The Stewardess Board No. 2 was organized much later than Stewardess Board No. 1. Mrs. Nora Lee Caldwell served as president of Board No. 2 for a number of years. Mrs. Henrietta Work has served as president from 1970 to the present. She has served well and she has a membership of 17. Other officers are: Secretary—Mrs. Margaret Sloan, Treasurer—Mrs. Estelle Withers.

DEACONESS BOARD

The original Deaconess Board was organized under the leadership of Rev. D. L. Blakey. It was composed of seven faithful members: Mrs. Maggie Reid, Mrs. Lucy Patterson, Mrs. Lettia Black, Mrs. Cora Robinson (all deceased), Mrs. Agnes Potts and Mrs. Maccie Cornelius. As years passed Mrs. Girlee Brice, Mrs. Sarah Gaston, Mrs. Bunie Heath, Mrs. Mattie Reid (all deceased), Mrs. Louise Anderson and Mrs. Catherine Work became members. The present officers are: President—Mrs. Annie Barringer, Vice President—Mrs. Jennie V. Brice, Secretary—Mrs. Rosena Work, Assistant Secretary—Mrs. Mattie Monteith, Treasurer—Mrs. Marjorie Thompson. Present members are: Mrs. Mary Kerns, Mrs. Juanita Archie, Mrs. Katie Reid, Mrs. Ella Mae Black, Mrs. Ada Caldwell, Mrs. Cordia Cherry, Mrs. Odessa Haynes, Mrs. Katie Graham, Ms. Katherine Work, Mrs. Maccie Cornelius and Mrs. Agnes Potts.

THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

The Christian Education Department was organized in 1968 under the leadership of Rev. J. N. Torrence. The first officers were: President—Samuel Knox, Vice President—Mrs. Bobbie Potts, Secretary—Mrs. Eudean Knox, Treasurer—Willie Torrence. Mrs. Bobbie Potts, Mrs. Eva Torrence and Raymond Cuthbertson have served as president of this organization through the years. Our present officers are Mrs. Susie Cuthbertson, Director; Mrs. Juanita Archie, Assistant Director; Ms. Vertie Torrence, Secretary; Mrs. Georgia Black, Assistant Secretary; Mrs. Nannie Potts, Treasurer.

THE WOMAN'S HOME AND OVERSEAS MISSIONARY SOCIETY

The Woman's Home and Overseas Missionary Society is presently under the leadership of Mrs. Roberta Derr. Mrs. Derr has been the president for over twenty years. Mrs. Derr succeeded Mrs. Maggie Reid as president. She has served well and the society has been very successful in their mission. The present officers along with Mrs. Derr are: Vice President—Mrs. Rissie Work, Secretary—Mrs. Margaret Sloan, Treasurer—Ms. Martha Black.

THE BUDS OF PROMISE

The Buds of Promise was reorganized in 1963 under the leadership of Rev. J. N. Torrence. Mrs. Elsie Sherrill was named superintendent of the Buds of Promise. Today, 21 years later, Mrs. Sherrill is still serving as superintendent of the Buds.

Many of the Buds have since become members of the Young Y's, and YAMS (Young Adult Missionaries). Their theme song is "Blooming For Jesus" and their hymn is "I Will Be True". The colors are green and white. The age is Beginners 3-6, Primary 7-9, and Juniors 10-12.

YAMS

At the inception of the YAMS (Young Adult Missionary Society) in 1982, 12 young women between the ages of 27 to 40 formed a working organization separate from the parent body of WHAFO Missionaries. This group was headed by President Margaret J. Howard. Our goals were and still are to help the parent body. Present officers are: President—Jennie Patterson, Vice President—Frances Foster, Secretary—Anitra Howard, Treasurer—Deborah Howard.

THE PASTOR'S AIDE BOARD

The Pastor's Aide Board was reorganized under the leadership of the Rev. E. K. Walkins during the year of 1957. The purpose of this board was and is to help the pastor, his family and the church in any way it can. The Pastor's Aide Board takes pride and enjoys carrying out its responsibilities.

In 1980, Mrs. Bobbie L. Potts was appointed president under the leadership of Rev. G. W. Thompson. Mrs. Potts and her members worked together faithfully in helping with the needs of the pastor and his family. Mrs. Jennie V. Brice became president in 1981 and is still serving in this capacity. Work, Ms. Catherine Work, Mrs. Susie Cuthbertson, Mrs. Henrietta Work, Mrs. Bobbie Potts, Mrs. Jennie V. Brice, Mrs. Vertie Torrence, Mrs. Juanita Archie, Mrs. Annie Barringer and Mrs. Jennie Patterson.

CHURCH SCHOOL

Our forefathers realized that the church school department was a vital component of any church. Therefore, it was one of the original auxiliaries established during the organization of Torrence Chapel Church.

Superintendents and dynamic leaders during the earlier years of the church were: Mr. Sam Glaspie, Mr. L. A. Little, Mr. Jim Dean, Mr. G. A. Burton, Mr. C. A. Caldwell, Mr. D. S. Reid, and Mr. William S. Work. These leaders were so dedicated that some were inspired to have Bible study or story hour for community residents wherever they could find space.

Some of our more recent superintendents include Mr. R. A. Work, Mr. James Davis, Rev. R. C. Jones, Ms. Joan Stinson, Mr. R. E. Cuthbertson, Mr. James Barringer, and Mrs. Mattie Montieth, our current superintendent. This board made many donations to the Trustees and did much toward the comfort and beautification of the church. The Senior Usher Board led the campaign to install new pews and later for better comfort had cushions made. This board was responsible for installing carpet and lights.

Margaret Howard was elected president 1981-1983 until her death. Mrs. Carrie P. Howard, vice president, led the Usher Board to finish out the conference year. Vertie D. Torrence is now presidnt, and doing an excellent job. A number of eager young members have joined and they are willing and ready to do whatever they can. Present officers along with the president are: Vice President—Carrie Howard, Secretary—Annie Mae Gaston, Assistant Secretary and one of the Head Ushers—Jennie Patterson, Treasurer—C. W. Howard; the other Head Usher—Wilson Stinson.

THE JUNIOR USHER BOARD

The Junior Usher Board was reorganized in 1974 by the late Mrs. Margaret Howard. Previously the group had served as Willing Workers. Projects undertaken by the ushers were serving on each youth Sunday and purchasing of a cross for the church.

Mrs. Mae Audrey Springs became adviser of the board in 1980. She served for two years. The Board continues to grow and serve on each Sunday receiving the Junior Church offering.

In 1982 Mrs. Carrie Howard was named adviser of the board. Projects undertaken include purchasing of Bibles for the church.

Presently the board consists of 52 members. They celebrate their anniversary each year. At this time a contest is held. In 1983 the winner was Qulanda Barringer and runner-up was Yashia Brandon. Leslie Mayhew was 1983 Usher of the Year. 1984 winner was Yashia Brandon and runner-up was Alan Work. Usher of the Year for 1984 was Sharon Stinson. We thank God for our many blessings and the success of all our achievements.

The first organized Junior Church was under the supervision of Mrs. Bertha Jones, who served many years. Others who have served as leaders through the years are: Mrs. Margaret Howard, Mrs. Mazella Forney, Mrs. Eudean Knox, Mrs. Mary Frances Kerns, Mrs. Lottie Little, Mrs. Patricia Stinson, Mrs. Ethel Davis and Mrs. Dorothy Knox. The present Junior Church is under the leadership of a Junior Church Board. The officers are: President—Mrs. Margaret Sloan, Vice President—Mrs. Emily Kornegay, Corresponding Secretary—Mrs. Eudean Knox, Financial Secretary—Steven Howard, Treasurer—Gerald Potts. Recently new robes have been purchased for two singing groups. A very successful concert was presented on May 6, 1984. Our singers were under the direction of Sonny Turner, Jr., at the time of the concert. The Junior Church is in charge of morning worship service the last Sunday of each month. Our youth are very aggressive and eager to serve in the service of our Lord and Savior. All members of the Junior Church do not belong to the singing groups. However, they render other services such as ushers, stewards, etc.







THE BRUSH ARBOR

Torrence Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church had its beginning a few years prior to 1869 by the Rev. Ephrim Torrence with only a few members.

After many trails and hardships, a "Brush Arbor" was built to serve as a place to worship. The land for this structure was located across the road (what is now Torrence Chapel Road) from the present church. Here each year, relatives and friends came from far and near to commune and worship God, meet old and new friends, and have one glorious good time—sometimes lasting on into the early morning.

A few years later, the membership moved to the present location and built a frame structure (in the year 1869), on a site of land given to them by white friends. Years passed and the Trustees were told by the Blakely family (owners of the land) that the Arbor had to be moved. In 1941, the Rev. N. V. Jones and the Trustees saw fit to move the Arbor onto the present church property. The present Arbor is the place where members, relatives and friends meet on the second Sunday in August each year for camp meeting. The Arbor is also used for family reunions and is ideal spot for a Easter Sunrise service.
